## **Policies and Procedures: LBHS Scholarship Foundation**

This policy pertains to those funds administered and/or disbursed by the Laguna Beach High School Scholarship Foundation (LBHSSF).

- 1) The scholarship application form requires a student to commit in writing to:
  - a) Attend the Honors Convocation.
  - b) Write a letter of appreciation to the donor of each award received by that student.
- 2) Scholarship Awards are to be used exclusively for expenses necessary for attending an accredited secondary educational institution and must be claimed within one year of high school
- 3) Verification of Enrollment forms received at the Honors Convocation must be completed by the school attended by the scholarship recipient and returned to LBHS before any funds will be disbursed. Enrollment forms are included in the scholarship award package distributed at the Honors Convocation.
- 4) As a rule, Scholarship funds will not be distributed to less than full-time students. Full time is defined as 12 units or more. Students, carrying less than 12 units, with special circumstances, may request a waiver by submitting their written request for a waiver to LBHSSF. Waivers will be reviewed and authorized by the scholarship donor and/or the LBHSSF.
- 5) Students must claim their awards or submit a written request for a one-time, one-year extension of eligibility by June 30 of the year following their high school graduation. The extension request letter must be addressed to the LBHSSF Coordinator. Students may only make one such request per award. After this period, unclaimed funds will be returned to the General Scholarship Fund of the Foundation to be used for student awards.
- 6) Upon receipt of the official verification of enrollment and the receipt of a copy of the letter of appreciation, scholarship award checks will be written payable to the institution attended and sent directly to the institution's financial aid office. The Scholarship Coordinator will begin sending award checks to the institutions by September 30th following graduation.

Approved at the LBHS Scholarship Foundation meeting of October 8, 2008.

## **Other Information**

### **Local Scholarships:**

Any student applying for a local scholarship must complete the LBHS Local Scholarship Application. Scholarships are available for students with and without financial need: the proper category, need and/or not need must be selected on the application. Each scholarship indicates if need is a part of the consideration. The LBHS Local Scholarship Application requires a recent photograph, and an interview. Most scholarships award the money in early fall when the student presents "Verification of Enrollment" from their university, college, or school to the LBHSSF.

The information for each scholarship in this booklet is as accurate as possible at press time, but may change before the Honors Convocation.

## All Around Top Student

---

### Assistance League of Laguna Beach Scholarship

For a senior with all around participation in school activities, community service and academics. (Family of Assistance League of Laguna Beach members and Assisteens are not eligible for the scholarship.)

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, resume, essay, written explanation of financial need. Financial need is required.*

The Assistance League of Laguna Beach Scholarship was established in 1975 to assist an all around LBHS senior with college expenses.

The Assistance League determines the winner.

*Award: Amount and number of scholarships may vary*

### Allen Bell Memorial Scholarship Fund

Senior man or woman with a minimum GPA of 3.0, plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college, university or trade school, has shown diversity by participating in sports, the arts or community service, has traits of concern for others indicated by kindness, courage, self-reliance, initiative and integrity.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship application, letters of recommendation, essay. Financial need may be considered.*

This scholarship was established in 2003 in memory and honor of Allen Bell who unexpectedly passed away in March 2003. Allen himself was the recipient of a scholarship which allowed him to attend USC and graduate with a Master's Degree in Geophysics /Geology. Allen lived his life with joy and appreciation of love and the benefits of hardwork. He was a man of good moral character, honesty, integrity and always showed consideration, respect, kindness and concern for others in all areas of his life.

The Bell family selects the winners.

*Award: 2 / \$250 (amount may vary)*

### Ebell Club Scholarship(s)

Top twenty five students of the graduating class with at least 80 community service hours

*Requirements: Ebell Club sends applications to qualified students. Minimum of 80 hours community service. Financial need is not required.*

The Ebell Club of Laguna Beach was founded in 1933, and has been supporting our community for more than 75 years. They help across a broad spectrum of need, including education, health, welfare, and community spirit, focusing on ongoing support of organizations that fulfill those needs, as well as assisting in cases of sudden need. Ebell was the first scholarship presented by the high school.

The names of the top twenty five students in the graduating class, who have completed 80 hours of community service, and those with very special achievement in some area are sent to the to the Ebell Club Scholarship Committee for their selection process. Focus of the scholarship is on Community Service. The Ebell Club believes that volunteering is a lifelong pursuit, which helps improve the community. Therefore they consider volunteering an important part of the selection process.

*Award: 4 / \$1000 each (amount and number may vary)*

### Exchange Club Youth of the Year Award

Senior woman and man with the following criteria for the past four years - at least a 3.0 GPA, school and community activities.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The Laguna Beach Exchange Club is proud to honor students with these awards. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 and be involved with school and community activities.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the winners.

*Award: \$500 each for one male and one female*

### Grapes for Grads Scholarship

LBHS senior with at least 3.0 GPA, 100 hours of community service, with preference to student working in Laguna Beach, plans to attend two or four year college or accredited trade school

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application. Financial need is not required.*

Hosted by the Rotary Club of Laguna Beach, Grapes for Grads raises funds to provide scholarships for students of Laguna Beach High School and Laguna College of Art & Design.

Selection by Grapes for Grad Committee

*Award: 2 \$2,000 awards*

### Kiwanis: H. Lee Burton Memorial Scholarship

Senior showing all around achievement, good grades and a display of good citizenship.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

The Laguna Kiwanis set up a scholarship fund in 1986 to honor H. Lee Burton. Kiwanis members volunteer time to raise funds to support community activities such as this scholarship.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the recipient.

*Award: \$500 (amount may vary)*

### Jessica Wagner Memorial Scholarship

All-around top senior excelling in academics and either (1) school or community involvement, or (2) athletics, or (3) both.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, letter of recommendation, minimum 3.3 GPA, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The Jessica Wagner Memorial Scholarship was established by the family of Jessica Wagner, a 1993 LBHS graduate and 1993 LBHS Senior Class President. Jessica died on May 11, 1996 in a car accident returning home after her junior year at Southern Methodist University.

Jessica strove and achieved excellence in academics, athletics and school and community involvement. Her family has established this scholarship to honor students with similar achievements.

The Wagner family selects recipient

*Award: \$2200 (amount may vary)*

## **Architecture**

### Christian Abel Memorial Scholarship

LBHS senior interested in architecture or related artistic field (art/landscape/engineering), who plans to attend a junior college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay, example of student's original work. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was established in 2004 in memory of Laguna Beach resident, Chris Abel. Chris grew up in Laguna Beach, graduated from Laguna Beach High School, started his architecture business, raised his family and continued to live in Laguna until his death. His friends and family wanted to honor Chris' long successful life in Laguna Beach by awarding a scholarship to a LBHS graduate interested in architecture or a related artistic field.

The family will select the recipient.

*Award: \$500 (amount may vary)*

## **Arts & Community Involvement**

### Laguna Board of Realtors and Affiliates

Graduating seniors with an interest in art who have demonstrated community involvement with a minimum of sixty community service hours..

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship application, essay, resume, transcript. Financial need is required.*

The mission of the Laguna Board of Realtors Charitable Assistance Fund is to support local non-profit service organizations by donating funds to help them continue their work in the community. CAF sponsors the Taste for Charity and the Pet Parade/Chili Cook-Off events each year, involving local community volunteers, REALTOR and AFFILIATE members. Donations are given to local organizations which may not have consistent sources of funding. The members of the Laguna Board of Realtors believe in giving back to the community and supporting the arts. They want to encourage students who have the same goals.

Committee of Laguna Board of Realtors Charitable Assistance Fund members select recipients.

*Award: 2 / \$750 each (may vary)*

## **Arts & Humanities**

### Charlotte W. Munro Scholarship

Senior woman or man applying to college in the field of music, fine arts, creative writing, literature and/or possesses a commitment to teaching in those fields.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, minimum 3.0 GPA, essay. Financial need is required.*

This scholarship was established in 1998 to honor the memory of Charlotte Munro, mother of a retired Thurston Middle School English teacher. Mrs. Munro worked in Laguna for many years at Laguna Federal and was very connected to this town and to education in general.

Family determines winner.

*Award: \$250*

## **Athletics**

### LBHS Athletic Boosters Scholarship Award

College-bound senior male/female athlete who participated in LBHS athletics at varsity level for at least two years. Student must have exhibited exemplary leadership, citizenship, and strength of character on and off the field.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was created in 2008 by the LBHS Athletic Boosters to promote character, leadership and sportsmanship as an example to future athletes at LBHS.

Board of Athletic Boosters select recipients.

*Award: \$1000 / 2 male athletes, \$1000 / 2 female athletes*

### AYSO, Region 86, Laguna Beach Scholarship

LBHS Senior(s) who has volunteered as a coach or referee for AYSO Region 86.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was established in 2008 to assist LBHS students who have volunteered their time to help AYSO Region 86.

LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the winner.

*Award: Amount varies*

### Juan Castano Memorial Scholarship

Senior with Hispanic heritage participating in a sport.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, participation in a sport. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was created by friends honoring LBHS athlete, Juan Castano, who died from health problems in 1997. Juan is remembered for his participation on the LBHS 1997 CIF Championship Soccer Team as well as for his positive attitude and relentless energy. Hispanic applicants must have demonstrated good academic standing and dedication to a sport.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the winner.

*Award: \$750 (amount may vary)*

### Masson Foundation Water Polo Scholarship

Water polo athletes who have met or exceeded outstanding academic and leadership traits during their high school years at LBHS. Transfer students will be considered.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need may be considered.*

This scholarship was created to recognize LBHS water polo athletes that show leadership, positive attitude and personal integrity, academic excellence, as well as a commitment to the LBHS water polo program, school and community. Applicants must be committed to playing collegiate water polo.

Applicants will be evaluated on leadership principals including:

Academic excellence and attitude  
Commitment (to water polo and academic excellence)  
Engagement and leadership  
Service to the community, team and school

The Masson Foundation determines the recipients.

*Award: 2 scholarships up to \$5000 each may be awarded; one male and one female player*

### Carmelita Nava Softball Award

Graduating senior girl who has participated in softball during her years in high school.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was established by family and friends of Carmelita Nava, long time employee of LBHS and Assistant Junior Varsity Softball Coach.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee selects the winner.

*Award: \$500*

### Bill O'Brien, Class of '57, Memorial Scholarship

LBHS Senior man or woman who has participated in athletics at the varsity level, plans to continue athletic and academic endeavors in a two or four year college, shows positive attitude, competitive spirit, and has a GPA of 3.0 or better.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, athletic resume, essay . Financial need is required.*

This memorial scholarship was established in 2009 by the many friends of Bill O'Brien, LBHS Class of 1957. Bill was an outstanding athlete and his participation in the LBHS's athletic program was exceptional. He was an enthusiastic sports fan his entire life.

The award is to financially assist a deserving student athlete that is involved in one or more sports at LBHS. The student must have plans to continue their academic and athletic endeavors at either a community or four-year college. The senior man or woman should have a 3.0 GPA or better, show a positive attitude, and have a competitive spirit.

Bill O'Brien Friends Committee determines the recipient.

*Award: \$1000 (amount may vary)*

### Mark Tiner Memorial Spirit Award

Senior Male Volleyball player.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, played at least one year Varsity volleyball. Financial need is not required.*

In 2005, The Mark P. Tiner Spirit Award was established in loving memory of Mark Tiner, a member of the LBHS Volleyball Team.

Mark loved the game of volleyball and played the sport with pure dedication and enthusiasm. "Big Tiny's" happiness put a smile on spectators that watched him play.

The purpose of this scholarship is to honor a senior varsity boy's volleyball player who displays these similar qualities.

Sponsor selects recipient.

*Award: \$1,000*

### **Paul Wollam Scholarship**

LBHS senior who is bound for Berkeley and has touched others by helping and giving back.

*Requirements: LBHSSF Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship has been created to honor the life and 'aloha spirit' of Paul Wollam who passed away unexpectedly in 2011. Paul was a Laguna Beach resident, father of three Laguna kids, and a Berkeley alumni. Paul loved his community and this scholarship is intended for a student who too embraces the 'aloha spirit' of caring and touching family and others.

Family selects recipient.

*Award: \$1000 (amount and number may vary)*

---

### **Boys & Girls Club of Laguna Beach Scholarship - Main Branch**

Current or former member within the past five years.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, resume, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The Boys & Girls Club (formerly the Boys Club) of Laguna Beach established this award in 1987 in support of Laguna Beach youth. The Club provides after school and summer activities that focus on the (5) Core Program Areas of: Character and Leadership Development, Education and Career Development, Health and Life Skills, The Arts, Sports, Fitness and Recreation.

Sponsor selects winner.

*Award: \$500*

## **Business Administration**

---

### **Claes Andersen Hospitality Scholarship Fund**

Senior with career interest in culinary, hotel or restaurant management, event planning or related pursuits preferred. Demonstrated self-motivation.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, minimum GPA 2.5, essay. Financial need may be considered.*

The Community of Laguna Beach lost a philanthropist and humanitarian when Claes Andersen passed away on August 11, 2010. Claes was a hospitality industry leader who revived the historic Hotel Laguna and gave generously to his community. Claes' passion as an hotelier, master chef, and restaurateur contributed to the ever-rising level of excellence of the cuisine of Laguna Beach's restaurants. As a parent of Stefan and Katie, he was active in AYSO and loved coaching soccer. As a philanthropist, Claes frequently opened his doors for community fundraising, raising over \$300,000 to support Laguna Beach school children through SchoolPower. He was a long time supporter of the Laguna Canyon Foundation. The years of giving back earned Claes many accolades and awards, including 2008 Citizen of the Year, Spirit of Laguna Award and the Person of the Year Award. He was honored by SchoolPower in 2006. The Boys & Girls Club of Laguna Beach named their cafeteria CLAES, as their way of thanking him for his generous contributions and tremendous support. Claes Andersen's philosophy was "We give back and promote what we have. That's why we live in a beautiful place."

Andersen Family will assist in selection of recipient.

*Award: \$500 per recipient.*

### **Anna Mary Beck Business Administration Scholarship**

Senior planning a business administration major in college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship, essay, resume, GPA of 3.0 or better. Financial need is not required.*

This award was established in memory of Anna Mary Beck for a graduating student planning to major in Business Administration.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines recipient.

*Award: \$2250 (amount may vary)*

### Laguna Beach Business Club Entrepreneurial Scholarship

Senior with demonstrated entrepreneurial spirit, creativity and initiative that is planning to attend a two or four year college or vocational institution. The student should also exhibit integrity, kindness and compassion for others.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, resume, letter of recommendation, essay, interview. Financial need may be considered.*

The Laguna Beach Business Club (LBBC) is a vibrant group of distinguished professionals working across a broad spectrum of businesses. Members live or work in the community and meet for breakfast on a monthly basis. Founded in 1996, LBBC is about integrity, friendship, diversity, curiosity, community, and professional and personal growth.

In 2011, LBBC will be awarding a scholarship for the second time with the intention of encouraging the entrepreneurial spirit in a changing business environment.

LBBC will review resumes and essays and then interview students for their final selection.

*Award: \$1,000*

### Keith Childers Memorial Scholarship

Senior with good citizenship attributes, planning a Business Administration major in college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was established in 1992 in memory of Keith Childers who helped young students throughout his life; first as a Scout Leader and then as a Student Body President at a large college. Later he volunteered at the Optimist Boy's Home, Children's Home Society and Masonic Youth groups. During his ten years of employment by the Laguna Beach School District he took an active and supportive interest in student activities.

Applicants for this scholarship should be able to demonstrate traits of leadership ability, good moral character, honesty, citizenship, patriotism and exhibit qualities of consideration and concern for others.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee selects the winner.

*Award: \$1200 (amount may vary)*

### Citizens Business Bank Scholarship

Senior going into 'business' field.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

First American Capital Bank, then Orange National Bank, now Citizens Business Bank, established this scholarship to assist a student who has demonstrated a potential for continued success. The applicants should be in the top 50% of the class and planning further education for a Bachelor's degree or a Technical Training Certificate.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the recipient.

*Award: \$250 (amount and number may vary)*

## California Community College

---

### Rotary - Paul Harris 'Service Above Self' Award

LBHS Senior planning to enroll as a full-time student in an accredited California Community College. The applicant should exhibit traits of striving towards the Rotary goal of Service Above Self.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, minimum 80 community service hours, essay. Financial need is required*

This scholarship was established to support students who have shown strength of character and concern for others through involvement in community service and will attend a California community college.

The Rotary of Laguna Beach will select the winner(s).

*Award: 2/ \$500 each (amount may vary)*

### Dr. Steven and Mrs. Lor Speach Community College Scholarship

LBHS senior planning to enroll as a full-time student in an accredited California Community College.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship application, essay, minimum 2.0 GPA. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was started in 2008 by a local family who strongly believes in the value of the community college education. The goal of this program is to assist and motivate deserving students to realize their full academic potential.

Dr. and Mrs. Speach will review essays, interview applicants and select recipients.

*Award: 10 / \$500 each*

---

### AAUW, Laguna Beach Branch Scholarship

Senior female planning to attend a two-year or four-year educational institution.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial Need Required.*

The American Association of University Women (AAUW) is the oldest and largest national organization working for the education and advancement of women and girls. AAUW Laguna Beach supports Tech Trek, a summer science camp for girls, an after school tutoring program and local agencies that help women and girls. One of the current missions of AAUW is to encourage girls to enter fields that are under represented by women such as science, technology, engineering and math.

The AAUW, Laguna Beach Branch Scholarship was awarded for the first time in 1998.

The AAUW Laguna Beach Branch Scholarship Committee selects the winner.

*Award: \$2000 (amount and number of awards may vary)*

## Christian Service & Leadership

---

### Heather Brobeck Memorial Scholarship

LBHS graduating senior with a Christian belief system who demonstrates leadership qualities, charisma for life, and plans to attend a four-year college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, statement answering four questions. Financial need may be a consideration.*

This scholarship was to honor the life of Heather Brobeck. The purpose of this scholarship is to financially assist a deserving student who is actively engaged in a local church and embodies Heather's spirit - a strong leader who was full of determination and exuded a love for others and for life.

Family determines recipient.

*Award: \$1000*

### Christian Service Award

One woman and one man with exceptional Christian service and leadership in church and community.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application. Financial need is not required.*

This award was established in 1987 by the Laguna Presbyterian Church. It was created to honor LBHS senior women and men who have demonstrated exceptional Christian service and leadership in both church and community activities.

The Christian Service Award Committee is responsible for the final selection.

*Award: 2 / \$250 (amount and number may vary)*

### Mark Tiner Memorial Scholarship

Senior showing all around achievement, displaying good moral character and plans to attend a 2 or 4-year college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, resume, minimum 3.0 GPA. Essay. Financial need is not required.*

In 2004, the Mark Tiner Memorial Scholarship was established in loving memory of Mark Tiner, a LBHS sophomore who passed away in a non-alcohol related automobile accident. Following in his father's footsteps, Mark was a second-generation LBHS student. While competing on the LBHS Boys' Volleyball and Surf Teams, Mark's charismatic personality became widely known. In his free time, Mark earned the rank of Eagle Scout and enjoyed rapping, creating artwork and sharing his passion for God.

The Mark P. Tiner Scholarship Committee determines the recipient(s).

*Award: \$1000 (amount may vary)*

## Citizenship

---

### Les Chatham Memorial Award, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 5868

LBHS seniors interested in the values of citizenship, patriotism and love of country.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The Laguna Post 5868 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars established this scholarship in 2000. The award is in memory of Les Chatham who believed and practiced his love of country.

The VFW organization selects the winners.

*Award: \$200 Bonds are given to two recipients*

## Civic, community and/or environment

---

### American Legion Post 222 Citizenship Award

Two men and two women who exhibit good citizenship.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The local American Legion awards two men and two women who exhibit good citizenship through their involvement in school and community activities with the characteristics of courage, honor, leadership, patriotism and service. The awards are for past accomplishments and do not depend on the student's future plans.

The American Legion sponsors a publication, "Need a Lift," a catalog of scholarships available nationwide. To see a copy of this publication, see LBHS Scholarship Coordinator.

The LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee recommends four students to the local American Legion Post.

*Award: 4 / \$200 bonds*

### South Laguna Civic Association Scholarship

LBHS senior living in South Laguna with interest and involvement in civic, community and/or environmental affairs.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, resume, transcript, essay, proof of residency in South Laguna. Financial need required.*

South Laguna Civic Association was formed in 1946 to promote the community and environmental interests of South Laguna. This scholarship is intended for a LBHS graduating senior who resides in South Laguna. Recipients will have demonstrated both scholastic achievement and service to the South Laguna Community, as well as an abiding interest and involvement in civic, community and/or environmental affairs.

South Laguna Civic Association determines winner.

*Award: \$1000*

## **Community College, Trade or Vocational School**

### **Jennifer Lynn Bammer Memorial Scholarship**

LBHS senior who is planning on attending a community college.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

This scholarship was established in 2003 in memory of Jennifer Bammer, a former LBHS student who was killed in an auto crash. Her family has established this scholarship to help deserving students attend a Community College.

The family determines the winner.

### Kenneth G. Beyer Memorial Scholarship

Leadership in school and community and religious involvement.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

Kenneth G. Beyer was the founder and first president of SchoolPower, the Laguna Beach Education Foundation. Mr. Beyer was involved with education at the college level. He was also willing to share his talents with his community. The scholarship was created in his memory in 1983.

Senior demonstrating all around school achievement, community involvement and excellence in citizenship, with emphasis on financial need.

### Walt Lawson Student Service Challenge Scholarship

Senior who has contributed a minimum of 100 hours of community service within the past twelve months.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

This scholarship was created in 2011 by the Ostensen family to support a LBHS senior with strong goals as they pursue his/her post-secondary education.

The Ostensen family selects recipient.

*Award: \$2000*

### Rotary - Harry Bithell "Service Above Self" Award

Senior planning to attend a four year college or university with history of substantial involvement in, and contributions to, a LBHS service club and local community through service.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application. Member of Interact Club (minimum one year) or other LBHS service club. Minimum GPA 2.5, class rank. Minimum 100 community service hours. Essay, interview with committee members. Financial need is not required.*

The purpose of this scholarship is to recognize a senior who has exhibited traits of striving towards the Rotary goal of Service Above Self through involvement in community service.

### Winston and Dorothy Updegraff Memorial Scholarship

## **Drama-Theater-Performing Arts**

---

### **Festival of Arts Scholarship - Performing Arts**

Laguna Beach High School seniors who have shown excellence in Performing Arts and intend to continue their studies in at least one of the associated disciplines at an accredited institution.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, transcript (minimum 2.5 GPA), resume, cover letter, interview, signed agreement, auditions and/or provide samples of work. Financial need is not required.*

The Festival of Arts established their scholarship program in 1957 with a single award in Visual Arts. The program has grown to include Film, Performing Arts and Writing. The program was established to provide financial encouragement for students who have demonstrated a capacity for excellence at LBHS and wish to further their education in the area of Performing Arts.

Awards are made on the basis of academic achievement, school and community involvement, aesthetic expression, and professional goals. Evaluation of work samples provides 40% of a student's score; grades, extracurricular activities and the interview comprise the other 60%. Minimum GPA 2.5 required.

Festival of Arts Scholarship Workshop will be held on Thursday, February 2, 2012 in the LBHS Library during SDL (7:30 am). Members of the FOA Scholarship Committee will review the application process and answer questions.

Varying number of awards in each category. The amount of the award for the first year will be at least \$1000. The recipient may apply for renewal for a total of four awards for undergraduate study over five years from the date of high school graduation. Students may apply for all four FOA Scholarships (Film, Performing Arts, Visual Arts, Writing), but only one scholarship will be awarded.

*Award: Multiple awards, renewable for four years (initial award minimum \$1000)*

### **LBHS Performing Arts Booster Scholarship**

LBHS Senior who has auditioned or participated in drama their senior year in addition to prior years of drama productions.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, No Square Theatre application. Financial need is not required.*

No Square Theatre of Laguna Beach will award one scholarship to a meritorious student pursuing an education in the Performing Arts at an accredited college or university. Given as a one time award, the scholarship is available to graduating seniors in Laguna Beach. See [www.nosquare.org](http://www.nosquare.org) for information.

In March, No Square will determine those qualifying for auditions and auditions will be held in April.

### Melvin J. Tonkon MD Medical Scholarship

LBHS Senior pursuing a career in medicine. Special consideration given to students who have overcome adversity and/or physical and medical challenges.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This memorial scholarship was established in 2008 by friends and family after the death of Laguna Beach resident Dr. Melvin J. Tonkon. Dr. Tonkon was a world-renowned cardiologist and lecturer who led ground breaking research on heart disease and other illnesses. During his life, not only did he maintain a private practice, but also volunteered for twenty years with the OC Chapter of the American Heart Association as well as supervised numerous studies that led to the development and approval of medications to treat hypertension, coronary disease and heart failure.

Former bandmates and friends will review songs and an essay submitted by the applicant. Passion for music very important. GPA is not a consideration

This scholarship is intended to make a difference in the life of a student who may have been at risk, faced obstacles to succeed and might not otherwise have a choice or opportunity for a future program after LBHS. Applicants need to demonstrate future potential.

### April Crevier and Daphne Crevier Memorial Scholarships

LBHS Senior, with existing extreme financial hardships, who is committed and determinedly persevering to further his/her education.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is required.*

In 2000 the Daphne Crevier Memorial Scholarship was created by Donnie Crevier in honor of his mother, Daphne Crevier. In 2001 the April Crevier Memorial Scholarship was created by Donnie Crevier in honor of his sister April Crevier. The fundamental purpose of these scholarships is to recognize, honor and provide financial support to assist motivated and determined seniors attend college

Joey was sworn in as an Honorary Police Officer and also received a Medal of Courage. Joey was bright, witty and wise and gave every endeavor his all.

---

### Camron Blackburn Memorial Scholarship

Senior woman scholar/athlete with a minimum 3.5 GPA in a strong academic curriculum and in sports.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, minimum GPA, essay, transcript. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship was established in memory of Camron Blackburn, who as a seventh grader at Thurston in 1981 died in an automobile accident. Camron had been very active in many sports and involved as a leader in school activities.

Applicants must be involved in one or more sports, but not necessarily an organized sport at LBHS. This scholarship is not based on financial need, but strictly on achievements.

The finalist is selected through an interview with a specially selected scholarship committee.

### Linda Fortune Memorial Scholarship

Senior varsity volleyball athlete with strong GPA and leadership skills.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, varsity volleyball team member, essay, resume. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship is in memory of Linda Fortune, who was instrumental in establishing club volleyball programs in Laguna Beach. Mrs. Fortune was a successful fifth grade teacher in Dana Point and worked diligently as a community leader and volunteer.

Her son Scott Fortune is a LBHS alumnus and followed in his mother's love for volleyball. He played volleyball at LBHS and went on to play at Stanford University. At LBHS and in college, Reedy was one of the most popular and energetic students, always full of creative ideas and great plans. As a surfer, skimboarder, snowboarder, and soccer player, he pushed himself with daring ability and intelligence; with Reedy, mind and body worked as one.

### LBHS Faculty La Vern Dugger Memorial Scholarship

Senior(s) with special achievements.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

This scholarship is sponsored by the LBHS faculty to honor LaVern Dugger. LaVern Dugger was inspirational to many in his roles as LBHS coach, teacher and administrator and also as a Laguna Beach lifeguard.

Applicants should reflect Mr. Dugger's traits of honesty, good sportsmanship, friendliness and ability to work hard.

### "Ace Award" Accepting the Challenge of Excellence

Senior who has overcome personal adversities and has shown a marked academic improvement during his or her high school career.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, essay. Financial need is not required.*

The Exchange Club of Laguna Beach established this scholarship in 1995 to recognize high school seniors who have shown a dramatic change in their attitude and performance during their high school years. These changes have enabled the student to overcome adversities and prepare for graduation.

LBHS Faculty Scholarship Committee determines the winner.

*Award: \$500 (amount may vary)*

### Don Nichols Scholarship(s)

Seniors planning to attend a California community college or a four year college/university.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, transcript, essay. Financial need is required.*

This award, first established in 1991 by Don Nichols, is to encourage high school seniors to further their formal education. This scholarship is awarded to students with average or better academic achievements, but with special attention given to those who have worked especially hard, made specific use of their talents, and show ability to benefit from a college education.

The following criteria should be considered when applying for this award:

1. Minimum 2.5 GPA

Family and friends established this scholarship in November 2007, in memory of Jerome Karp who, for twenty-nine years, was a Special Education teacher, Softball, Baseball, and Basketball Coach at LBHS (1972 - 2001).

## Visual Arts

---

### Festival of Arts Scholarship - Film

Laguna Beach High School seniors who have shown excellence in Film and intend to continue their studies in at least one of the associated disciplines at an accredited institution.

*Requirements: LBHS Local Scholarship Application, transcript, minimum 2.5 GPA), resume, cover letter, interview, signed agreement, samples of directing, production, post production. Financial need is not required.*

The Festival of Arts established their scholarship program in 1957 with a single award in Visual Arts. The program has grown to include Film, Performing Arts and Writing. The program was established to provide financial encouragement for students who have demonstrated a capacity for excellence at LBHS and wish to further their education in the area of Film Production.

Awards are made on the basis of academic achievement, school and community involvement, aesthetic expression, and professional goals. Evaluation of work samples provides 40% of a student's score; grades, extracurricular activities and the interview comprise the other 60%.

Festival of Arts Scholarship Workshop will be held on Thursday, February 2, 2012 in the LBHS Library during SDL (7:30 am). Members of the FOA Scholarship Committee will review the application process and answer questions.

Varying number of awards in each category. The amount of the award for the first year will be at least \$1000. The recipient may apply for renewal for a total of four awards for undergraduate study over five years from the date of high school graduation.
